

Danley: 'We have the ability to keep winning'

Dominguez, who came on in the third after Hood pitched 2 1/3 solid innings, allowing only three runs, two of which were earned.

Dominguez, with the dirtiest uniform on the field, proceeded to steal the show, pitching the remaining 4 2/3 innings, and allowing five runs, one short of the Eaton lead.

The dirt on Dominguez's uniform was a result of his

other talent: Hitting. In other words, Dominguez found his way to the bases as he went 2-for-4 with 2 RBI and earned his coaches vote as the game MVP.

"If I had to choose an MVP, it would be Dusty. He really stepped up and pitched well. He also hit very well. In the tournament, he was 14-for-28, so he hit .500," Danley said.

Danley then made it clear that the team was fortunate to have several leaders that helped the team to a 18-2 league record, 33-10 overall.

"Garrett Walker, Dusty Dominguez, Travis Anderson, Jordan Hungenberg, they have all been leaders this summer," said a proud coach Danley. "This is a young team and if we can become more disciplined we have the ability to keep winning."
