Knee injury keeps left fielder from reaching potential

EATON — An attempt to intercept a pass from his free safety position during the football playoffs last fall made for a frustrating baseball season this spring for Garrett Walker.

Walker, the starting left fielder for the Eaton Reds (20-3), who will be playing Faith Christian (19-4) in the semifinals of the Class 3A Baseball State Tournament at 1 p.m. today at Runyon Field in Pueblo, was

destined to be the Reds' next big star heading into this season.

had knee surgery Dec. 4.

The surgery wasn't your basic one. "They cut open my left leg and they cut a piece off my patella tendon to make it my new anterior cruciate ligament," Walker said.

If Reds head coach Jim Danley could redshirt Walker for this season, he certainly would have done that.

"Modern medicine is a wonderful thing, and we've got him out here where he can safely play, but he's not healed. Garrett Walker at half speed is

still better than most of the players in this league, and many of the players in our program," said Danley, who won his 550th career game in the regional semifinals last Saturday against Bishop Machebeuf. "He's a vear away from being back to where he was. He's given us everything he's got, and that's all anybody can do."

The left-handed hitting Walker is not the same hitter he was a year ago.

"Last year I thought he was the best left-handed hitter in the league, and maybe the best hitter in the

league," said Danley, whose Reds are 6-0 lifetime against Faith Christian. "He was hitting three ropes a game."

This year Walker's hitting .265, an average he could maintain with his eyes closed. Walker also has a home run, 21 RBI and an on-base percentage of .494. Most high school players would love to have those numbers, but Walker isn't like most high school players.

"It's been real frustrating because you feel like you're not helping the team as much as you could," said Walker, who hits in the No. 5 hole. "You've just got to work through it, and do what you

Not being able to turn on a fastball because of the surgically repaired knee hasn't been fun for Walker, who has four extra-base hits this year compared to 11 last year.

"The toughest has been hitting. Getting back to being able to turn on it and twist on my knee, I've been collapsing a lot because it's hard to straighten and twist," said Walker, who has struck out only seven times the last two seasons. "I've tried all kind of different stances to help it."

Walker realizes he just has to work through the injury. Danley doubted whether Walker was going to play after the injury.

"You can't just bounce back from something like that and be an All-American," said Walker, who is undecided about next year but would like to play baseball in col-

Danley said Walker will excel at the collegiate level.

"He's a kid that a college team ought to take a chance on," said Danley, who was undecided about who he would start on the pitching for th mound against the Eagles.
